Getting Totally Involved in Missions

Mark 16:15

We hear of missions-minded churches that have a great mission s program. Bible Baptist Church, does not have a mission s program We ARE a mission s program! Missions is our sole purpose for e istence.

Our e ample in missions is the Lord Jesus Christ, who came from heaven to planet earth to save us (John 3:16). His mission was to make a wa for us to be restored to fellowship with God and thereb go heaven. As the solg b Squire Parsons sa s, When I could not go to H h, He came to me! ____eing in the form of God, He came in the likeness of en, and became bedient to the cross, even to the death of the cross

Or lesus made a wa for us to be saved b His death burial and resurregion, He commissioned His followers to carr out His mission (Mk. 16:15). Jesus said before ascending back to heaven

But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghest is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. (Acts 1:8)

We should take a lesson from Coca-Cola. Coke is lmost ever where. ow did it get there? It s motto: THINK GLOBALLY JT ACT LOCALLY. Vhat this slogan is to Coke, the Great Commission

to the church.

However, the earl church at Jerusalem was slow h taking the gospel outside the cit limits. The church at Jerusalem ha (1) The **Multitude** (2) the **Might** (3) the **Message**, but that it did not hav MISSIONS. Therefore, the Lord allowed persecution to scatter the church to do what He wanted it to do (read Acts 8:1, 4).

The mission of the church is the evangeli ation of the world. When God loved, He loved the world. When the Father gave His Son, He gave His Son for the world. When the Son died, He died for the world. God s vision is the world.

If the business of Bible Baptist Church is not God s business, then our church has no business being in business!

Let s look at three areas we must be involved in missions:

I. Missions must start in the HEAD.

- The head is where our thinking takes place. The purpose of a mission s conference is to educate ou on what the Bible sa s about missions. The Bible is the menu for our mission s conference.
- A. You must RECOGNIZE the truth. The truth is
 - 1. All men are born lost, dead in sin, and condemned to hell (Rom. 3:23).
 - 2. The Gospel of Christ is the onl means that will save the lost (Rom. 1:16).
 - 3. Ever Christian is responsible to get the Gospel to the LOST. God has "committed to us the word of reconciliation... we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God" (2 Cor. 5:19-20).
- B. You must RECEIVE the truth (Mt. 13:23). We must have a **teachable spirit**. Your **attitude** in this conference should be, God has something to sa to me and I will attend and listen. As Samuel pra ed, *"Speak, Lord; for thy servant heareth"* (1 Sam. 3:10).
 - 1. Receive the truth readil (Acts 17:11).
 - 2. Receive the truth gladl (Acts 2:41).
- C. You must RESPOND to the truth.
 - 1. B submission (Acts 2:41).
 - 2. B obedience. "Give me understanding, and I shall keep thy *law; yea, I shall observe it with my whole heart.* (Ps. 119:34).

II. Missions must go to the HEART.

Once ou have the mind to receive it, then must go to our heart. This is also true of salvation. Some know the truth in their heads, but have never trusted Christ in their heart. The heart is our seat of emotions. As ou appl God s Word to our heart ou will feel what ou trul believe. The Word of God begins to instill faith (Rom. 10:17).

I know we do not go b our feelings. Faith *will* affect how ou feel, but how ou feel should not affect our faith. As the song b Craig Edwards sa s, I know we re not saved b feelings, but it feels good!

- A. There will be a PASSION for missions.
 - 1. The more ou know about missions and our missionaries, the stronger ou will feel about it.
 - 2. You will become passionate about it. The **definition** of passion is <u>an intense, driving, or overcoming feeling, or conviction</u>.
- B. There will be a COMPASSION in missions. It is impossible to have compassion and remain complacent or indifferent. Compassion MOVES someone to do something to take action!

Jude 22-23 And of some have compassion, making a difference... pulling them out of the fire

- 1. The **key to compassion** is SEEING the need. Jeremiah wrote, "Mine eye affecteth mine heart" (Lam. 3:51). Jesus *SAW* the multitudes, he was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd" (Mt. 9:36). "And Jesus went forth, and *saw* a great multitude, and was moved with compassion toward them, and he healed their sick." (Mt. 14:14)
- How s our vision of missions? Are ou seeing as Jesus sees? As Mike Otto s song sa s, Let me see this world, dear Lord; As though I were looking through Your e es.

Former Michigan State football coach Duff Daughert tells about a winning field goal kicked b Dave Kaiser against UCLA man ears ago. The game was in Los Angeles and the field goal gave Michigan State a 17-14 victor. As Kaiser came back to the bench, Coach Daughert said: "Nice kick, Dave. But I noticed ou didn t watch the ball after ou kicked it. How come?"

Kaiser replied, "I was watching the referee to see how he would call it. You see, I forgot m contact lenses back at the hotel. I couldn t even see the goal posts!

That s our problem We re not seeing God s goal posts Multitudes who are lost and need the Gospel. Remember, *"Where there is no vision, the people perish."* (Prov. 29:18)

III. Missions must continue with the HANDS.

When the head is right about missions, and the heart is right about missions, then the hands will to be right.

Hands symbolize action. We work with our hands talk with our hands minister with our hands fight with our hands. We use our hands to sign contracts write checks or pla a musical instrument. We use our hand to show jo or disgust. The touch of a hand can communicate one s feelings.

Your hands reveal something about ou (Job 37:7): Dish pan hands the carpenter s hands the mechanics hands. Someone noted, the position of the hands is s mbolic of the position of the heart.

- A. A raised hand can indicate a **willingness to volunteer**. A raised hand sa s, I understand what is being asked and feel strong enough about it to be involved. That is what this mission s conference will be looking for Volunteers!
- B. Raised hands also indicate surrender. Come out with our hands up! To be involved in missions means surrendering our will to God s will.
 - To raise our hand ou ma need to let go of something ou are holding on to. If ou continue to hold on to whatever it is, it will weigh our hands down and keep ou from raising them in surrender.

Abraham had to let go of his kindred and home in Ur of the Caldees to go where God wanted him (Gen. 12:1-5). Moses had to let go of the treasures of Eg pt (Heb. 11:24-27).

Elisha had to let go of his o en and plow (2 Kings 19:19-20).

Peter and John had to let go of their fishing nets to follow lesus (Mt. 4:20).

Matthew had to leave his ceipt of custom (Mt. 10:10).

L le and Janet Tremble has to let go of well paing jobs and a beautiful home in keba to go to the mission field of China.

Are ou holding on to something that is keeping ou from serving God? It ma be' (fill in the blanks).
